Dear Retail Food and/or Liquor Licensee:

We are writing to advise you that the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment has implemented a revised **COVID-19 Dial** in **Public Health Order 20-36**, as amended, found [here](#). A summary of the requirements of this Order in each level of the **Dial**, can be found [here](#). Please make sure that you are familiar with and implementing the restrictions in your business that apply to your county's level in the Dial. As retail food and/or liquor licensees, your compliance with executive orders and public health orders are required as part of your license.

Additionally, note that both the Governor's executive orders and the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's public health orders require all individuals in indoor public spaces wear a face covering.¹ These face coverings may only be removed while seated for dining, but must otherwise be worn while moving about the establishment.

Our State is facing a significant public health crisis, and these orders are for the protection of the health and safety of all Coloradans. The State is prepared to enforce its orders through available regulatory and legal actions. Businesses that ignore or willfully violate the executive orders or public health orders put their business licenses at risk of administrative actions, which may include suspension, revocation, fines and/or cancellation in accordance with applicable statutes and regulations.
