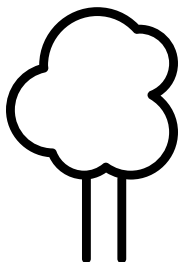


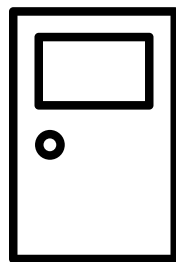
Pet Dogs in an Outdoor Dining Area

Section 25-4-1615 of the Colorado Revised Statutes allows pet dogs in outdoor dining areas. If a restaurant decides to allow this, the following must be met:



Pet Location

Pet dogs are only allowed in outdoor dining areas.



Pet Entrance

A separate entrance to the outdoor dining area must be available and used so that pet dogs do not pass through or enter the restaurant at any time.



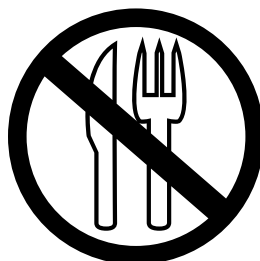
Leashes

Pet dogs must be on a leash or in a pet carrier. The animal must be under control of the owner at all times.



Seats & Furniture

Pet dogs are not allowed on any seats, benches, chairs or other furniture or fixtures.



Food Preparation

The outdoor dining area cannot be used for any food preparation. Filling a drink from a pitcher is allowed.



Local Rules

Local law must be followed. A jurisdiction may prohibit pet dogs or may have additional requirements for pet dogs on outdoor dining areas.

A person who brings a pet dog in an outdoor dining area is responsible for the behavior of that pet dog. This is not intended to restrict the presence of a service animal.
